
Each one of you is welcome to join us for worship. What an encouragement it would be to us to have you with us. Come and join us as we move into this season of remembrance.






We really need some more volunteers to help in the cafe for a couple of hours once or twice a month.



'Resurrection is postponed - due to snow.'


