#### Structure Governance and Management

#### **Governing Document**

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution Unitary Form.

#### Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session Members are the Elders of the Church, who are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The Minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. Rev Hilda Smith retired in August 2021 and Mrs Alison Hay was appointed as Interim Moderator in September 2021.

#### **Organisational Structure**

The Kirk Session is chaired by the Minister and normally meets six or seven times a year. This body is responsible for spiritual and temporal affairs within the Church.

Due to Covid restrictions this year, mainly virtual Session meetings and only two face to face meetings have taken place.

Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate.

#### **Objectives and Activities**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in policy. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It cooperates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

The Church did not reopen for regular weekly worship until 6<sup>th</sup> June 2021. A monthly Coffee Morning is normally held for eight months of the year for fundraising for the General Fund. The Hall is also regularly hired out to many local groups/organisations.

All these activities slowly restarted in 2021 on a restricted basis which is monitored and we hope to be able to maintain this and build on it once again.

Social events are organised by the Social Committee and the Project Fund is reliant on funds raised at these events.



The Guild did not meet from March 2020 until the first meeting of the new session in October 2021, due to covid restrictions. The Guild year runs from October to March each year and is well attended. At present it only meets once a month and has 14 members. The Guild Strategy for 2021-2024 is LOOK FORWARD IN FAITH and the Theme for 2021-22 is LIGHTS AND BUSHELS. The Guild did not support a Project in 2021 but will choose one of the new ones for 2022. The Guild normally distributes funds raised at Coffee Mornings and collections to various charities. These include the Church Flower Fund, Crossreach, Malawi Fruits, Mercy Ships, Leprosy Mission and several local charities, as well as giving to the Church.

#### **Fabric Fund**

The Fabric Fund covers all maintenance work to Church Properties and is normally funded by Hall income and transfers from the Project Renewal Fund.

A Consolidated Fabric Fund is held at '121' and the surplus balance held therein covers repairs and maintenance of all the church buildings, as and when necessary.

#### **Financial Review**

Our principal source of income is from weekly offerings, Gift Aid donations and by Standing Orders. The church was closed from March 2020 until June 2021 and although many in the congregation continued to support us financially by new Standing Orders and/or direct payments to the Bank, as well as continuing to use FWO envelopes which were sent to the Treasurer intermittently throughout the year, our overall income however, was significantly reduced by the big drop in income sourced from Coffee Mornings and other social fundraising events.

General Fund net income this year amounts to £29,607 against expenses of £30,315 leaving a small deficit. Gift Aid Tax of £5,295 was reclaimed for General Fund (we depend heavily on this refund of tax each year). There was only a very small income from 2 Coffee Mornings in 2021, therefore a £5,000 transfer had to be made from Restricted Funds to maintain a credit balance in the General Fund for 2021.

The General Fund is responsible for payments for Stipend and related costs; Heat, Light and Power, Insurance etc. Most members use FWO envelopes and/or Standing Orders and where relevant, have signed a Gift Aid Declaration.

The Project Renewal Fund is held solely for the future development and refurbishment of the Hall and Church and is funded by social events, donations and retiring offerings. These are restricted funds.

#### **Reserves Policy**

We do not have sufficient funds to create annual reserves. We are mostly in a position of holding a balance of one/two months expenditure in General Fund. It should be noted that we are not fully funding stipend. In 2021 the cost of a Parish Minister with five years' service, employers National Insurance and Pension contribution was £35,269. However, since August 2021, when our Minister retired, we have been a vacant charge and do not pay stipend and instead only have Pulpit Supply fees and expenses. We do not expect this to change in 2022.

#### Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to



enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### Report of Independent Examiner
